# Lesson 4 Islam's Core Beliefs

- Islam's main teachings come from the Prophet Muhammed
- Mohammed believed he received the last revelation from Allah on what is Truth
  - "Muslims regard the Quran as Muhammad's most important miracle, a proof of his prophethood,<sup>[23]</sup> and the culmination of a series of divine messages starting with those revealed to <u>Adam</u>, including the <u>Tawrah</u> (<u>Torah</u>), the <u>Zabur</u> ("<u>Psalms</u>") and the <u>Injil</u> ("Gospel"), and ending with Muhammad's revelation." <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Quran">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Quran</a>

<u>Truth Factor</u> - But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach a gospel other than the one we preached to you, let them be under God's curse! – Galatians 1:8

- The main scriptures in Islam are:
  - The Koran (Writings of Muhammed's teachings), believed to be the last revelation from Allah
  - o Hadith (Writings from Muhammed's life and traditions
- Mohammed did not personally write the "Koran", but Muhammed's teachings were memorized and then compiled into a book call the "Koran" (which means "the recitation") and was actually written down some 20 years after his death by his followers.

#### **Right Beliefs in Islam**

#### Six Articles of Faith

From Nebeel Qureshi "No God But One"

- 1. Belief that Allah is not relational. "Allah is not a Father, and Allah is not a Son (Quran 112). He is an absolute unity, a monad."
- 2. "Belief in the prophets"
- 3. "Belief in divinely inspired books" (Includes Koran and Hadith)
- 4. "Belief in angels and the unseen"
- 5. "Belief in the day of judgment"
- 6. "Belief in Allah's predestining sovereignty"

#### 5 Pillars of Islam

- The 5 Pillars of Islam are the most important ways in which Muslim's believe they can be acceptable to Allah:
- 1. Shahadah A statement of belief which is recited. It says that Allah is the only god and that Muhammad is his messenger.
- 2. Salat Praying to Allah five times a day.
  - a. Before prayer Muslims must participate in Wudu (the ritual of washing hands, feet, and face 3 times to make themselves pure and clean).

<u>Truth Factor</u> - <sup>25</sup> "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You clean the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of greed and self-indulgence. <sup>26</sup> Blind Pharisee! First clean the inside of the cup and dish, and then the outside also will be clean. <sup>27</sup> "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You are like whitewashed tombs, which look beautiful on the outside but on the inside are full of the bones of the dead and everything unclean. <sup>28</sup> In the same way, on the outside you appear to people as righteous but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness. – Matthew 23:25-28

#### The Blood of Jesus is what cleanses us from all sin. 1 John 1:7 (NIV)

<sup>7</sup> But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

- b. Muslims participate in a ritual prayer called "Rak'ah" which involves standing, then kneeling, then putting the forehead to the ground as a sign of submission.
- 3. Zakat Giving money to charity to help the poor and those in need.
- 4. Sawm Fasting during the month of Ramadan. They fast go without food, drink, smoking, or sex from sunrise to sunset.
- 5. Hajj A pilgrimage to the holy city of Makkah which Muslims must try to complete at least once in their lives.

## 8 Concepts to Understand Soteriology (The Study of Salvation) Islam in Light of these 8 Concepts

# Allah is believed by Muslims to be the true God and creator of all things. He is not relational or intimate (close) to his creation.

"Nothing in the Quran suggests that Allah desires intimacy with humanity. We are not his beloved—just one of his creatures." - Qureshi – "No God but One" Location 792

#### The highest sacred scripture of Islam is the Quran.

#### **Standard**

"The Quran is, to Muslims, the eternal Word of Allah himself. It is the closest thing to God incarnate. To Christians, the eternal Word of Yahweh is Jesus. The Quran holds in Islam the place that Jesus holds in the Christian faith." – Qureshi "No God but One" location 1397

# The Second highest sacred scriptures are the Hadith (example and practices of Muhammed's life).

"They teach that Allah intended certain verses to be recited but not practiced, and other verses to be practiced but not recited. For these reasons, Muslims scholars turn to the records of Muhammad's life, the hadith, for clarification. In addition, as we have already seen, most Islamic practices actually come from hadith and not from the Quran."- Qureshi "No God but One" Location 1481

Muslim's believe the Quran and Hadith have the highest authority and the standard of what is honorable and good and reveal what is shameful and wrong.

#### Hermeneutic – The Science of Interpretation

"Grasping the orality of the Quran helps with understanding the controversial phenomenon of abrogation. While Muhammad was still alive, he would give recitations that cancelled previous ones. In other words, he would tell his followers that certain portions of the Quran he had relayed before were no longer to be recited as part of the Quran. This was met with resistance, as people asked him how the Word of God could be cancelled. The response is recorded in 2.106 of the Quran, which asserts that Allah can substitute verses in his divine scripture because "he has power over all things." – Qureshi "No God But One" Location 1468

"Sin is not hereditary, and no one born is a sinner." "Muslim theologians explain man's nature at birth as fitrah: state of intrinsic goodness. Like Adam, people are born pure and sinless. They are Muslims by birth, and salvation is intact, but they must do all in their power to maintain this status. Everyone is "accountable for what he himself inscribes upon the unblemished Tabula Rasa or tablet of his nature."1" <sup>1</sup>Robert W. Thomas, Islam: Aspects and Prospects a Critical Analysis, http://www.zwemercenter.com/guide/sin-according-to-muslims/ Sin "Muslims admit that maintaining a sinless life in the long run is impossible and that *fitrah* does not last. Humans become polluted due to outside evil influences." http://www.zwemercenter.com/guide/sin-according-to-muslims/ Disobedience is not rebellion; it is failure to remember God's instructions, and Satan's goal is to make us forget his guidance (58:19; 20:115). Since we are weak and forgetful, God sent prophets to remind us of the true path. "The primary task of the prophets is to awaken man's conscience so that he can decipher the primordial writing on his heart more clearly and with greater conviction." Within each person is "an inborn inclination to believe and worship Allah."2 "It follows, then, that the greatest tragedy that can happen in a man's life is that he turn away from the remembrance of God. For, when he forgets Allah, he degenerates into a slave of his own base desires whose life becomes characterized by evil and corruption." "God remembrance," is key to overcoming temptation and producing tagwa (piety). Phil Parshall, veteran missionary among Muslims, said this: "It is difficult to communicate the biblical meaning of sin to a Muslim. His outlook is horizontal rather than vertical. ### Lesson 5: Honor/Shame in the Gospel

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Standard	God is king and creator and is the standard of all that is honorable & good. He is the most powerful being and deserves to be honored as Lord/God and King. We should love, respect, and obey God above any other because He should be number one in our lives.	Revelation 4:11 "Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created."
Sin	SIN Sin means to miss the mark or to fall short. We as people miss the mark of always keeping God as #1 in our hearts. We fall short of honoring God and we honor ourselves or others as kings/rulers when we don't love and obey Him fully.	Romans 2:23 "You who boast in the law dishonor God by breaking the law."
Sharre	SHAME To have shame means to lose face (or turn ones face away). Shame involves embarrassment and fear. When our sin and rebellion is exposed/seen by God or others we feel bad and afraid of what might happen. Shame is the fear of losing honor, love, and respect from God and from others. We deserve punishment in eternal shame.	Jeremiah 17:13 "O Lord, the hope of Israel, all who forsake you <u>shall be put to</u> <u>shame;</u> those who turn away from you shall be written in the earth, for they have forsaken the Lord, the fountain of living water."
Separation	SEPARATION  Because people have dishonored God through disobedience to his commands, they have to be separated from God and his Kingdom. This separation is called death which is physical (body dies), spiritual (relational separation from God), & Eternal (Never Ending in Hell & Lake of Fire).	Isaiah 59:2 "But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your sins have hidden his face from you so that he does not hear."
Substitution	SUBSTITUTION  Jesus was willing to take our sin, shame and separation (death) that we deserve. He became a man so that He might substitute His honorable life, death, and resurrection on our behalf to restore us to an honorable relationship with Him.	I Peter 3:18 "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit,"
Saving Faith	SAVING FAITH  God reveals that we cannot restore our own honor and be good enough to be saved from shame and death. Saving faith involves following Jesus as Lord God/King & trusting the truth that His life, death, & resurrection has the power to save us.	Romans 10:9 "Because if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."
Salvation	SALVATION Salvation means deliverance or rescue. God knows that we dishonor Him, but because of His love for us and desire to keep His own honor, he offers salvation. This involves delivering us from shame & separation and rescuing us to restored honorable status as His kingdom children.	Romans 10:11 "For the Scripture says, 'Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame'."
Snetification	SANCTIFICATION  Sanctification means to be set apart for a purpose and to be cleaned. Once we trust Jesus and our relationship with Him is restored, we are continually being set apart as honorable children growing up into God's honorable people.	Philippians 1:6  "And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ."
